



Lifting the Lives of Our Deprived Communities – A New Strategic Approach

Background

The prolonged war in the North and East of Sri Lanka has left many communities in disarray and have deprived them of their livelihoods. Many young people have not known anything other than war for the entirety of their lives. Families are displaced and settled in areas that are not theirs traditionally. Since the end of the war in 2009, a lot of NGOs and also well-meaning diaspora of Tamil people living overseas have offered assistance in many ways to help the affected. This help ranged from food, shelter and clothing, setting up orphanages, old people homes etc and many more.

During the years immediately after the war this help certainly alleviated the immediate needs of the needy in the North and East. However, as years went by this mode of help has increasingly led people towards a habit of dependency and expectation that help is always going to be "given" to them – be it food, money, education, shelter

etc. at the expense of their own initiative. Even for their own basic needs of water, sanitation, food etc. people are expecting "help" to come through. When the help did not come or got delayed the communities fall into disarray and poverty and all hygiene and social problems set in.

<u>The Issues for the Future</u>

- 1. "Dependency mentality" help extended to the families over the last ten years by all well-meaning overseas organisations and relatives have left these families in a state of dependency mentality. They expect all their requirements for living to be "given" to them. The notion of having to work for the one's food, shelter and clothing is growing very thin in many communities in the North and East of Sri Lanka.
- 2. It is not entirely a criticism of the people. Diaspora and NGOs have essentially helped to cultivate this without realizing the long-term consequences.
- 3. This same dependency mentality has paralysed quite a large segment of the youth of the North and East, particularly the urban areas. This is very evident with clusters of Tamil youth gathering around the street corners with fancy motor cycles and also the booze culture that is quite prevalent. This has resulted in a number of job creation endeavors to fail – training institutes have not been able to fill positions, factories were not able to find workers etc.
- 4. The on-going support from the Tamil diaspora is not going to last forever. The people who left Sri Lanka before the war and also during the war are getting older. Their earning power overseas is not going to stay at this level forever. As they diminish so will their contribution towards their relatives or charities in Sri Lanka.
- 5. The NGO support also is likely to diminish over the short to medium future as the years move on from the conclusion of the war.

All these issues point to one thing - the current model of rehabilitation is unsustainable. For one - the overseas money (NGO, diaspora) being poured into various projects is not a long term guaranteed source of funds and other is our communities will be in a permanent state of dependency with no initiative or ability to create a sustainable livelihood. Something got to change.

A new light shining in the hills for smiling new generation of our Tamil community





Sri Lankan Tamil estate workers are living in a very poverty stricken situation over 250 years. Srivanni Maha Vidyalayam located in Kegale district in Central province with 433

children, KKM –Vanni Hope has sponsored 36 students during this reporting year, they are sitting the O-Levels this year. 28 students are sitting it for the first time and 8 are repeating their O' Level.



There are 11 Advance level students. The school principal informs us that as well as lacking tuition facilities; they are in dire need for a photocopier. A photocopier will enable them to be more efficient in all class preparation tasks and more productive for the students.

01. Education

Tharaniga sharing her experience

I am Balakrishnan Tharaniga and I live in Kilinochchi. My family was affected by the war. My father sustained physical injuries during the war and my mother is disabled. I have a younger sister.

While my father was working very hard and struggling to support my sister and me with our studies, we were fortunate to encounter Reverend Joshua. Reverend made it possible for me to receive monthly financial assistance through Kaveri Kala Manram - Vanni Hope. Due to this help, I have been able to continue my studies and even attend tuition classes.

My father had difficulty taking us to school on his push bike but now thanks to Mohidin Shariff family who have helped me through KKM – VH we can afford to go to school on an auto [three wheeler].

I also appreciate the advice and guidance given to me by KKM staff.

I scored 8 A's in my O'Levels and am hoping to score well in my A'Levels also. My dream is to study medicine and serve my community.

One day I hope to help other under privileged children with their studies – just like KKM Vanni Hope helped me.

Sangeetha sharing her experience

My name is Sangeetha Mahendran and I live in Krishnapuram. I am one of 3 children. My father's daily wage was stretched to support the education of his three daughters.

In 2017, I completed my A'Level in the Commerce field. I scored 3 A's and was ranked 7th in the district!

Through Kaveri Kala Manram – Vanni Hope, Mr Lakshman Swaminathan and Mrs Renu Swaminathan have supported me with a scholarship fund. This fund has helped pay for my tuition fee, exam fee and course fee.

I have secured a place in Sri Jayawardenepura University to follow a course in 'Public Special Management'.





I hope KKM – VH will be able to continue to help students like me.

Sugirtha sharing her experience

My name is Sugirtha Subramanium and I live in Malayalapuram, Kilinochchi. I am one of 5 siblings and including my parents there are 7 in the family.

My father works on a farm. My sister and I are students.

When my parents had difficulty meeting the financial expense of my higher education we were fortunate to come in contact with Kaveri Kala Manram.

Devanandan Sir and family, through Kaveri Kala Manram – Vanni Hope granted me an education scholarship. This enabled me to purchase necessary stationary, pay for my tuition fee and examination fee. In my A'Levels in the Maths stream I scored A and 2S and was placed 40th in my district.

I have been given a seat in the Eastern University in Trincomalee.

I intend to study well and gain an excellent qualification. Once I have qualified, my wish is to support other students like me Through Kaveri Kala Manram.



am Malarkodi. I wish to share what my life was like before and

after my encounter with KKM.

We had 3 children and my husband died of cancer in 2016. At first my children and I moved in with my mother in law in Panangandy. We later moved in with my parents in Piramanthanaaru.

I found it very difficult to educate my children. My mother helped us. Since I had no income my parents supported us financially.

Later on the land my parents gave me as dowry I built a temporary abode and lived with my children. We continued to live off my mother's earnings.

Due to my plight I received some coconut plants and some vegetable plants. I fetched water from my parent's well 200 meters away and started irrigating these plants.

An organization called KKM gave us access to much needed water on our land in the form of a tube well and a water holding tank. Not only this they even gave me 50 passion fruit plants, 7 coconut plants and 3 packet of spinach seeds. I started generating an income!

Spurred on by this I myself bought okra, spinach, eggplants, bitter hour and snake bean plants.

My 3 children and I will always be indebted to KKM for helping us turn our lives around.

To enhance Peace and reconciliation, KKM – Vanni Hope have held 32 interactive functions in the Central province in the past 6 months.








KKM – Vanni Hope is happy to report that we have held cultural events in Central, Northern and Eastern province to improve social welfare.
